7. Student will lead a discussion group during the semester, practicing their skills as a discipler.
8. Complete the Discipleship check-out form with your mentor.

Paper Guidelines

Reflection paper:

The student should choose one type of spiritual discipline and practice it for four weeks. Afterwards a 3 page reflection paper should be written sharing their experience. The paper should be double spaced and typed and can include research, reflection, and journaling.

Integration paper:

5 page integration paper. It should be double spaced and typed. Choose one concept within the assigned text and interact with it. Show how the lectures, various textbooks, Scripture and personal experience contribute to it. Answer the following questions within the paper:

- Why did this concept stand out to you?

- What impact does it suggest for you personally?

- How should this concept be communicated effectively to others?
